

Control of Major Accident Hazards Regulations (COMAH) 2015

The Site Operators listed below manufacture and store dangerous substances. This card is produced in accordance with the above regulations to advise you of the safety measures you should take in the unlikely event of a major accident on their sites (listed below) which could affect the public or the environment.

PLEASE READ this card carefully and follow the safety instructions given overleaf in the event of Community Warning System activation. The system will only be used in the event of a Major Incident. The sirens will be operated on an alert cycle of a **two tone** mode for **5 minutes**, followed by a **silent period** of **1 minute**. This alert cycle will be repeated for as long as it is considered necessary. The All Clear will be a single tone lasting for 5 minutes

PLEASE NOTE the Community Warning System is tested twice per year, at 7.00pm on the first Wednesday in June and 2.30pm on the first Wednesday in December. Information regarding the tests will be published prior to each test by posters, local media and responders' websites.

Householders and responsible persons in business/community premises must ensure that all occupants are familiar with the safety advice and the action to be taken. Remember the simple rule:

GO IN, STAY IN AND TUNE IN!

This card should be kept in a prominent and accessible place and should be passed on to any subsequent occupiers.

GO IN, STAY IN AND TUNE IN!

Community Warning - When the sirens are activated:

- 1 Immediately go indoors.
- 2 Shut all external doors and windows and all other means of ventilation.
- 3 Extinguish all naked lights.
- 4 If possible, go to an upper floor.
- 5 Tune into your local radio station, e.g.
